RE: Addendum #1 to the Invitation for Bids (IFB) for Baltimore City – Litter Abatement at the Quarantine Road Sanitary Landfill dated June 1, 2022

Prior to award of this contract, Bidders should not initiate any communications related to this project with Authority staff, or with employees or local elected officials of any Member Jurisdiction. Any communications other than through the avenues listed above may result in the disqualification of a Bidder's bid.

The pre-bid conference was held June 7, 2022 at 10:00 a.m. local time at the Quarantine Road Sanitary Landfill. A copy of the sign-in sheet for the pre-bid conference is attached to this Addendum #1. The Procurement discussion started at 10:03 a.m. and ended at 10:24 a.m. After the discussion there was a brief driving tour of the site with several stops. The pre-bid conference ended at 10:52 a.m.

1. The procurement discussion focused on the issued and publicly available IFB, and clarified the following items which are added to the IFB and are to be reflected in the bid submittals:
  - The selected vendor may, upon coordination with the City and the Authority, schedule work for Saturdays. *Added to Section I (Summary Statement) and Section VIII (Scope of Contractor Services/Requirements).*
  - Work is expected to begin in October of 2022 (Awardee will be advised of any schedule changes).

The following minimum hourly wage rates shall apply to all contracts in excess of One Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$100,000) in connection with new building construction, major remodeling and rehabilitation of buildings and for construction, reconstruction, erection, conversion installation, alteration, renovation, razing, demolition, moving or removing on any airport, pier wharf, sewer, drain, main, conduit, machinery or mechanical, electrical or other equipment or any other operation, or work to be done or performed in, on, upon or in connection with any building, bridge over water, tunnel, tower, stack, filtration plant, waste water or sewage treatment works, pumping stations, and other such structures.

**LABORER'S WORK**

Laborers may not assist mechanics in the performance of mechanic's work, nor use tools peculiar to established trades. Their work should be confined to the following manual tasks:

1. Digging and filling holes and trenches.
2. Loading, unloading and stockpiling materials.
3. Cleaning and sweeping.
4. Driving stakes.
5. Placing concrete and asphalt (not finishing)
6. Stripping forms.
7. Ripping out material which is to be discarded, including asbestos.
8. Clearing and grubbing.

The above definition is to preclude inadvertent misclassification of laborers.

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**CLASSIFICATION NO. 2**

The following minimum hourly wage rates shall apply on all construction contracts in excess of Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000) when such contracts involve work on highways and streets; and said work includes paving, repaving, construction and complete reconstruction. This classification also applies to repair, renovation or construction and reconstruction of viaducts and bridges predominately over land.
